Trident area Neighbourhood Policing Inspector Zahid Khan has won a District wide award for his work in promoting community cohesion in the Bradford Trident area.

Zahid faced tough competition with nominations from all over the Bradford District. The judges were very impressed with Inspector Khan's nomination, in particular his passion and commitment to be inclusive and his attempts to engage with all communities. Many local voluntary and community groups supported Zahid's nomination and wrote supporting letters.

The award was presented to Inspector Khan at a prestigious ceremony held at City Hall and chaired by the Lord Mayor of Bradford. On receiving the award Inspector Khan stated, 'I am very pleased and honoured to win this award, it shows me that people in the community have faith in the work that I am doing. This recognition is wonderful, but I will not rest here, this has further fuelled my passion to continue to improve the area. I want to give my community a quality bespoke Police service at a local level so that I can work with people to reduce crime and the fear of crime within our neighbourhoods.'

Inspector Khan has taken positive steps to bring people from diverse backgrounds and cultures together. His recent involvement has been to support and establish stronger links with Central and Eastern European communities. He has also worked closely with a number of local youth projects to increase their understanding of different cultures.

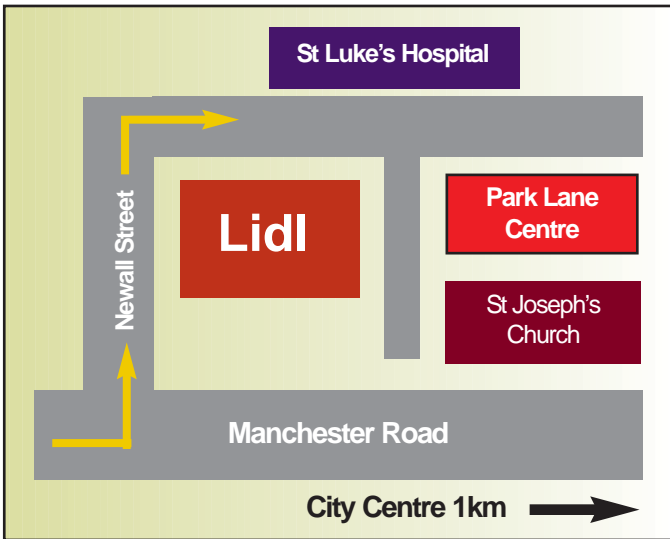

The YMCA is running an exciting project working with local young people and 'future community leaders' to promote cohesion, respect, working together and forgiveness.

The project has been funded by 'v', the youth volunteering charity and the 'Desmond Tutu Foundation UK'.

The project is looking to recruit two groups of young people aged 16-24 to take part in two 12 week part time volunteering opportunities. Each group will commence the programme with a weekend residential and subjects covered over the course of the programme include leadership, history, identity, community mapping, faith, cultures and diversity.

Amy Wilson the project manager says, 'This project is an ideal opportunity for local young people to learn about other cultures, religions and identities whilst at the same time enjoying themselves, making new friends and making a difference.'

One of the principles of the project is to encourage 'Ubuntu', which is an African word, the meaning of which can be summed up by the well known expression often used by Rev. Desmond Tutu 'we can be human only together'.

Terry Ryall, v Chief Executive, commented, 'v is delighted to be able to provide financial support to the YMCA through our Match Fund programme for this project which will inspire young people to volunteer in BD5.'

This is an accredited programme which will lead to a 'V50' qualification and a 'Youth Achievement Award'. Young people participating in the project will develop 'community challenges' focussed around their own areas of interest.

Amy adds, 'The first programme will run from July to September 2008 and the second will run from October to January 2009. The programmes are very flexible and we welcome suggestions about what interested young people would like included. Joe Holloway MBE

12 December 1925 - 10 May 2008

Former Bradford Trident Community Director for the Park Lane neighbourhood, Joe Holloway MBE, has died aged 82.

Joe passed away on Saturday May 5th in hospital following a short illness. Originally from Scotland Joe spent time in the Merchant Navy and lived in South Africa before returning to England. He settled in Bradford and became a TV engineer.

Joe became involved in the early stages of the development of regeneration partnership Bradford Trident serving on its shadow board. He was then elected as Community Director for the Park Lane area. He served on the board with unstinting diligence until July 2007 when ill health forced his retirement. Joe was particularly keen on issues affecting older people and on health matters making sure there were projects directed at their needs. He always spoke his mind and made many positive contributions to the community. He was a regular of the Little Horton Unity Club and in turn will be much missed by all those who knew him there.

In 2005 Joe was honoured with an MBE in recognition of his services to the community, an award of which he was extremely proud.

Chair of the Bradford Trident board Councillor Ian Greenwood said, 'Directors, staff and all those involved in Bradford Trident are deeply saddened to hear of the death of Joe. He was a pillar of the community who will be remembered with respect and affection by all who knew him. As well as taking his role as Community Director very seriously he had a great sense of humour. Without his dedication we would not have achieved as much as we have done. He will be sadly missed.'

Former Chief Executive of Bradford Trident Steve Hartley added, 'Joe was a great servant to Bradford Trident. He took the job very seriously and was involved in many crucial decisions. I will miss him both in a personal and professional capacity.'

Joe leaves his widow Evelyn whom our thoughts are with.

Lock doors and windows - Keep the Burglar out!!

Fantastic progress has been made in the fight against crime over the past few years. In particular burglaries are much lower than before. Even so from time to time we have surges of burglaries and this isn't helped if people leave doors and windows unlocked or open.

Remember - locks only work when someone locks them !! If you leave doors and windows open an offender can walk into your house and steal cherished and hard earned possessions.

More often than not the householder is present within the house when the burglar sneaks in - they might be pegging washing out, cleaning upstairs or having a pot of tea in the kitchen. That's all the time the offender needs. These crimes are not targeted but are opportunist. They are often difficult to detect but are very easy to prevent if you keep your doors and windows locked!

Research shows that the peak times that these offences are occurring are between 12 lunchtime and 4pm. The number of offences reported increases hour by hour from lunchtime up until around 3.30pm - do you leave your door unlocked when you nip to school to collect the kids?? Have you ever left the door open when you've nipped to the local shop??

Money, credit cards, handbags, mobile phones, keys, computers, plasma screens and DVD recorders are all taken. So look around, where is your handbag now?

On the kitchen worktop or by your living room chair? If you had it stolen what would you lose at the same time? Where are your credit cards - on top of the Microwave? PLEASE keep your door either chained or LOCKED.

Take your car & house keys upstairs with you when you go to bed. A growing number of offenders are now breaking into houses not for the plasma or DVD but the car keys. Rather than leave your keys and mobile phone on the kitchen worktop, take them upstairs. In addition to helping to reduce crime in the event of a fire you have the keys to assist in your exit from the premises and the means to call the fire service readily to hand. Finally, as your switching the TV off, just check the doors and windows are locked. A number of offences occur between 1am and 4am because some one forgot!

Crime is reducing in the BD5 area. The Community Police are helping to make a difference. We don't want you to feel a prisoner in your own home but we do need your help. We can patrol your streets but we can't lock your doors for you.

So, in case you've forgotten, Lock doors and windows - Keep the Burglar out!!

Hellboy II: The Golden Army
